The Sermon on the Mount: Anger Issues

Matthew 5:21-22

Matthew 5:21–22 (NIV) "You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment.' ²² But I tell you that anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment. Again, anyone who says this brother, 'Raca,' is answerable to the Sanhedrin. But anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell."
The System judges the action of murder. Matthew 5:21 (NIV) "You have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not murder, and anyone who murders will be subject to judgment." Exodus 20:13 (NIV) "You shall not murder."
The Savior judges the anger that leads to murder. Matthew 5:22 (NIV) "But I tell you that anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment. Again, anyone who says to his brother, 'Raca,' is answerable to the Sanhedrin. But anyone who says, 'You fool!' will be in danger of the fire of hell." 1. Jesus indicts the inward possession of anger. Matthew 5:22a (NIV) "But I tell you that anyone who is angry with his brother will be subject to judgment." Ephesians 4:26–27 (LB) "If you are angry, don't sin by nursing your grudge. Don't let the sun go down with you still angry—get over it quickly; ²⁷ for when you are angry, you give a mighty foothold to the devil." Proverbs 19:11 (NIV) "A man's wisdom gives him patience; it is to his glory to overlook an offense." 2. Jesus indicts the outward expressions of anger. Matthew 5:22b (NIV) "Again, anyone who says to his brother, 'Raca,' is answerable to the Sanhedrin." Jesus says 1. Hell is a place of eternal torment. (Luke 16:23) 2. Hell is a place with an unquenchable fire. (Mark 9:43) 3. Hell is a place where people weep and gnash their teeth. (Matt 13:42) 4. Hell is a place from which there is no return. (Luke 16:19–31) 5. Hell is a place of outer darkness. (Matt 25:30) 6. Hell is a place of outer darkness.
