Matthew 6:19-24

The things of <u>earth</u> are <u>temporarily</u> secure.

Matthew 6:19 (NIV) "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal."

Using Money Wisely

1. God gives us the ability to produce wealth.

Deuteronomy 8:18 (NIV) "But remember the Lord your God, for it is He who gives you the ability to produce wealth, and so confirms His covenant, which He swore to your forefathers, as it is today."

2. God expects us to save for the future.

Proverbs 21:20 (LB) "The wise man saves for the future, but the foolish man spends whatever he gets."

3. God encourages us to provide an inheritance.

2 Corinthians 12:14c (NCV) "... Children should not have to save up to give to their parents. Parents should save to give to their children."

4. God warns us <u>against greed</u>.

Luke 12:15 (NIV) "...He said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions."

Ecclesiastes 5:10 (NIV) "Whoever loves money never has money enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with his income. This too is meaningless."

The things in <u>heaven</u> are <u>eternally</u> secure.

Matthew 6:20 (NIV) "But store up for yourselves to	treasures in heaven, where moth and rust do no

Matthew 25:31–40 (NIV) "When the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, He will sit on His throne in heavenly glory. ³² All the nations will be gathered before Him, and He will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. ³³ He will put the sheep on His right and the goats on His left. ³⁴ "Then the King will say to those on His right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. ³⁵ For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, ³⁶ I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.' ³⁷ "Then the righteous will answer Him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to
