

## School Lunch

Luke 14:1-24

### Lesson #1: It is [better to face things head-on.](#)

📖 Luke 14:1–4 (NIV84) “One Sabbath, when Jesus went to eat in the house of a prominent Pharisee, He was being carefully watched. <sup>2</sup> There in front of Him was a man suffering from dropsy. <sup>3</sup> Jesus asked the Pharisees and experts in the law, “Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath or not?” <sup>4</sup> But they remained silent. So taking hold of the man, He healed him and sent him away.”

James 1:2–4 (NIV84) “Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, <sup>3</sup> because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. <sup>4</sup> Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.”

📖 Deuteronomy 31:6 (MSG) “Be strong. Take courage. Don’t be intimidated. Don’t give them a second thought because GOD, your God, is striding ahead of you. He’s right there with you. He won’t let you down; He won’t leave you.”

### Lesson #2: It is [never the wrong time to do the right thing.](#)

📖 Luke 14:5–6 (NIV84) “Then He asked them, “If one of you has a son or an ox that falls into a well on the Sabbath day, will you not immediately pull him out?” <sup>6</sup> And they had nothing to say.”

📖 James 4:17 (NLT) “Remember, it is sin to know what you ought to do and then not do it.”

### Lesson #3: It is [better to be elevated than humiliated.](#)

📖 Luke 14:7–11 (NIV84) “When He noticed how the guests picked the places of honor at the table, He told them this parable: <sup>8</sup> “When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take the place of honor, for a person more distinguished than you may have been invited. <sup>9</sup> If so, the host who invited both of you will come and say to you, ‘Give this man your seat.’ Then, humiliated, you will have to take the least important place. <sup>10</sup> But when you are invited, take the lowest place, so that when your host comes, he will say to you, ‘Friend, move up to a better place.’ Then you will be honored in the presence of all your fellow guests. <sup>11</sup> For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.”


📖 Proverbs 25:7a (NLT) “It’s better to wait for an invitation to the head table than to be sent away in public disgrace.”

### Lesson #4: It is [not about seeking repayment but paying it forward.](#)

📖 Luke 14:12–14 (NIV84) Then Jesus said to His host, “When you give a luncheon or dinner, do not invite your friends, your brothers or relatives, or your rich neighbors; if you do, they may invite you back and so you will be repaid. <sup>13</sup> But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, <sup>14</sup> and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.”

📖 Luke 14:15–24 (NIV84) “When one of those at the table with Him heard this, he said to Jesus, “Blessed is the man who will eat at the feast in the kingdom of God.” <sup>16</sup> Jesus replied: “A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. <sup>17</sup> At the time of the banquet he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, ‘Come, for everything is now ready.’ <sup>18</sup> “But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, ‘I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me.’ <sup>19</sup> “Another said, ‘I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I’m on my way to try them out. Please excuse me.’ <sup>20</sup> “Still another said, ‘I just got married, so I can’t come.’ <sup>21</sup> “The servant came back and reported this to his master. Then the owner of the house became angry and ordered his servant, ‘Go out quickly into the streets and alleys of the town and bring in the poor, the crippled, the blind and the lame.’ <sup>22</sup> “ ‘Sir,’ the servant said, ‘what you ordered has been done, but there is still room.’ <sup>23</sup> “Then the master told his servant, ‘Go out to the roads and country lanes and make them come in, so that my house will be full. <sup>24</sup> I tell you, not one of those men who were invited will get a taste of my banquet.’ ”

### Digging Deeper: Have you ever regretted running away from something?

 Describe a time when you faced something difficult head-on. Have you ever experienced someone refusing to do the right thing when you were sure they knew they should?
