	for Jerusalem."

## Martha was too busy to be blessed.

- Luke 10:38b–40 (NIV84) "...Martha opened her home to Him. <sup>39</sup> She had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet listening to what He said. <sup>40</sup> But Martha was distracted by all the preparations that had to be made. She came to Him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"
- □ John 15:5 (NIV84) "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing."

## Mary was too <u>captivated</u> to be <u>distracted</u>.

- Luke 10:39 (NLT) "...Mary, sat at the Lord's feet, listening to what He taught."
- ☐ Luke 10:39 (MSG) "Mary...sat before the Master, hanging on every word He said."
- Luke 10:41–42 (NIV84) "Martha, Martha," the Lord answered, "you are worried and upset about many things, <sup>42</sup> but only one thing is needed. Mary has chosen what is better, and it will not be taken away from her."
- Luke 10:40 (NIV84) "...She came to Him and asked, "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me to do the work by myself? Tell her to help me!"
