

## A Declaration of Dependence

Proverbs 14:34 & Jeremiah 18:1-10

📖 Proverbs 14:34 (NIV) “Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a disgrace to any people.”

### Righteousness **lifts** a nation.

📖 Proverbs 14:34 (NIV) “Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a disgrace to any people.”

1. Righteousness is not **legislated**.
2. Righteousness is not **inherited**.
3. Righteousness is not **earned**.
4. Righteousness is only **imputed**.

📖 2 Corinthians 5:21 (NIV) “God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.”

📖 Ephesians 2:8–9 (NIV) “For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—<sup>9</sup> not by works, so that no one can boast.”

### Sin **disgraces** a nation.

📖 Proverbs 14:34 (NIV) “Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a disgrace to any people.”

📖 Proverbs 13:6 (GNB) “Righteousness protects the innocent; wickedness is the downfall of sinners.”

### Repentance **revives** a nation.

📖 2 Chronicles 7:14 (NIV) “If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and will heal their land.”

📖 Jeremiah 18:1–10 (NIV) “This is the word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord: <sup>2</sup> “Go down to the potter’s house, and there I will give you my message.” <sup>3</sup> So I went down to the potter’s house, and I saw him working at the wheel. <sup>4</sup> But the pot he was shaping from the clay was marred in his hands; so the potter formed it into another pot, shaping it as seemed best to him. <sup>5</sup> Then the word of the Lord came to me: <sup>6</sup> “O house of Israel, can I not do with you as this potter does?” declares the Lord. “Like clay in the hand of the potter, so are you in my hand, O house of Israel. <sup>7</sup> If at any time I announce that a nation or kingdom is to be uprooted, torn down and destroyed, <sup>8</sup> and if that nation I warned repents of its evil, then I will relent and not inflict on it the disaster I had planned. <sup>9</sup> And if at another time I announce that a nation or kingdom is to be built up and planted, <sup>10</sup> and if it does evil in my sight and does not obey me, then I will reconsider the good I had intended to do for it.”

1. God will **lead us** if we will **listen to Him**. (1-2)
2. God will **use something familiar** to teach us something **new**. (3-6)
3. God will **mold us** into something **beautiful and useful**. (4-6)
4. God will **alter His response** depending on what **we do**. (7-10)
